Background – TWAM's Mission

Tools with a Mission is a Christian charity working mainly in sub-Saharan Africa. We collect usable donated tools from across the UK via a network of volunteer tool collectors. We refurbish them, sort them into trade kits and send them to the developing world for livelihood creation.

We work with churches, community groups and charities currently in DR Congo, Malawi, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe who are training local people in trade skills, such as tailoring, carpentry and mechanics. We provide the tools to equip the training centres as well as individual trade kits for graduating trainees.

TWAM is reliant on volunteers within the UK and overseas to support its work at every level, including many senior management positions. TWAM currently has approx 250 volunteer tools collectors across the country, supported by five volunteer van teams, and three refurbishment centres. In total around 450 volunteers and 8 staff.

Background – TWAM's Core Values

CEO's comments

TWAM has been working towards the objectives of a very ambitious 2020-2025 Strategic Plan. The biggest objective of this plan was the doubling in size of the charity and our output of refurbished tools sent to Africa from approximately half a million to a million every single year.

To achieve this we agreed to open a new large Refurbishment Centre in the Midlands to support and replicate the work of our original centre in Ipswich, Suffolk. The intention that the new centre would send 16, 20ft containers of refurbished donated tools to Africa every year.

We opened our new centre in Rugby in August 2022 with the first container dispatched in December. In 2023 the centre will send 8 containers.

The current manager has overseen the closure of our small workshop in Coventry and the opening of our new centre. However, they feel the day to day operation of the centre would be better managed by somebody with a different skill set. The successful candidate will be required to manage a team of volunteers (currently around 35) and a full time apprentice. They will receive the full support of the CEO, the Ipswich Refurbishment Centre Manager and Health and Safety Officer and the Operations Manager.

This role will be incredibly rewarding as it will impact the lives of literally thousands of people across Africa.

Purpose of Role

To manage the day to day running of the Rugby Refurbishment Centre. The Refurbishment Centre Manager is responsible for:

- Health and Safety and Fire Risk implementation and compliance
- The management of a dedicated team of volunteers
- The safe operation of the refurbishment and storage of tools and equipment
- Managing the refurbishment and preparation of tool kits to meet the container shipping requirements.
- The efficient administration, preparation and loading of containers



Scope of Role

The Refurbishment Centre Manager (RCM) will take the lead in the safe and efficient working of the shop floor, both the storage of non-refurbished tools, their sorting and refurbishing and the safe and efficient storage of tool kits and equipment prior to picking for despatch.

The Refurbishment Centre Manager will liaise with the Operations Manager and Ipswich Refurbishment Centre Manager to efficiently and correctly prepare shipping documents, pick and label kits, and safely load the containers. The RCM will also liaise with the Chief Executive and Operations Manager in the planning and implementation of the container shipping schedule.

This position will suit someone with experience managing a warehouse or small engineering facility with a knowledge of all current Health and Safety legislation and volunteer management best practice. The position requires someone able to work alongside volunteers, building a relationship of trust and shared respect. Full training will be given.

We are a Christian charity and the successful candidate will be expected to attend the end of week full staff prayer meeting where we have a mix of Christian and non-Christian staff. There is never any pressure for anybody to pray and nobody is made to feel uncomfortable.

Primary duties and responsibilities

1. Health and Safety Management

Maintain standards of health and safety, and ensure accurate records of all safety checks and equipment. Oversee the planned maintenance of vehicles, machinery and equipment. Liaise proactively with the Health and Safety consultants.

2. Fire Safety Management

Maintain the Fire Log Book and carry out all the requirements of fire safety regulation. Liaise proactively with the Fire Assessment consultants.

3. Volunteer Management

Organise the induction and training of paid and unpaid staff, as well as monitoring performance and progress. Motivate, organise and encourage teamwork within the workforce to ensure a friendly welcoming environment where teamwork leads to an efficient effective refurbishment centre.

Take responsibility for job allocation and work flow in the workshop including job scheduling for day to day operations.

4. Manage the efficient receipt, refurbishment and dispatch of tools and equipment Manage the efficient offloading and storage of tools and equipment, quickly identifying unuseable tools and disposing of them safely. Ensuring tools are refurbished to TWAM standards and toolkits are completed to TWAM specification.

5. Manage efficiently the use of refurbishment equipment

Ensure all equipment maintains Health and Safety standards and is regularly checked. Ensure all staff and volunteers are trained to use equipment safely and are confident in doing so. It will be essential that you supervise volunteers and staff to ensure these standards are maintained.

Identify staff and volunteers who require ongoing training and implement training opportunities to ensure their skills are improved.

6. Promptly and accurately respond to communication by email and telephone from the Country Coordinators, Operations Manager and other responsible staff and volunteers.

Respond promptly and accurately to requests for information concerning stock levels and tool availability.

7. Have a clear understanding of the company's policies and vision and how the Refurbishment Centre contributes to these

Maintain a working knowledge of TWAM policies relating to the safe operation of the Refurbishment Centre and Volunteer Management.
